

Small Health Care Provider Quality Improvement Program Data Dashboard Reporting Requirement

Instructions

Description:

Award recipients of the Small Health Care Provider Quality Improvement (Rural Quality) Program are required to establish and submit two data dashboards during the three-year grant period which include:

1. Key project measures and outcomes resulting from the implementation of grant funded activities and;
2. Demonstration of improvements to project-related patient health outcomes and quality of care.

Purpose:

- Provides the opportunity for projects to identify key project data that is supportive of ongoing data collection, tracking and utilization of project data across the three-year grant period.
- Compliments project data reported for annual Performance Improvement Measurement (PIMS) reporting by providing a platform that highlights project-specific measures not captured in PIMS.

Due Dates:

Data Dashboard Report #1

- Due: July 1 2020
- Reporting Period: Data related to funded grant project implementation occurring between 8/1/2019-7/1/2020
- Submission Type: HRSA Electronic Handbook (EHB) system submission under the Category Name “Other Submissions,” Submission Name “Year One Data Dashboard”

Data Dashboard Report #2

- Due: July 1 2022
- Reporting Period: Data related to funded grant project implementation occurring between 8/1/2019-7/1/2022
- Submission Type: HRSA Electronic Handbook (EHB) system submission under the Category Name “Other Submissions,” Submission Name “Year Three Data Dashboard”

Format:

- Can be tailored to reflect a format most suitable for meeting unique grant project data needs
- Use of the Stratis Health RQITA Data Tracking & Dashboard tool is encouraged, but not required.

At minimum, data dashboard submissions must include the following in order to satisfy the data dashboard reporting requirements:

1.	Reflects data spanning the requisite reporting period
2.	Identifies key project-specific measures for demonstration of grant project impacts
3.	Aligns with funded grant project goals, objectives, target population and activities implemented during the reporting period. Any deviations to this are clearly described and justified.
4.	Does not exceed 5 pages in length
5.	Submitted as either a Word or PDF document. Can be converted from other document forms prior to submission
6.	Includes a reference list of all relevant grant project goals and objectives reflected in the dashboard
7.	Demonstrates progress toward improvements to project-related patient health outcomes and quality of care
