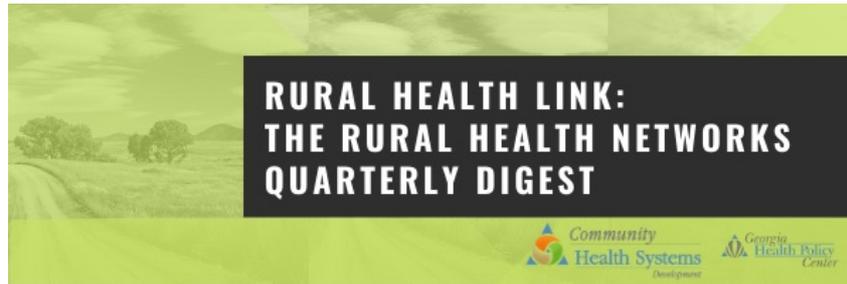

## Grantee Spotlight



### **St. Claire HealthCare/Northeast Kentucky Area Health Education Center (on behalf of the Northeast Kentucky Substance Use Response Coalition)**

The Northeast Kentucky Substance Use Response Coalition serves an 18-county service area in northeastern Kentucky (central Appalachia). The coalition is a formal network of eight health care and social service organizations working on building a community-based approach to address the opioid crisis. As part of the Network Development Program, the coalition, through the Northeast Kentucky Area Health Education Center, is deploying regional training with a focus on implementation of three evidence-based strategies including continuing medical education, mentoring, and youth prevention education. Overall, the project aims to increase access to Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT), particularly in the primary care setting.

This article in *The Journal of Rural Health* assesses telehealth adoption among hospitals located in rural and urban areas, and identifies barriers related to enhanced telehealth capabilities in the areas of patient engagement and health information exchange capacity with external providers and community partners.

### [Chronic Disease Management in the COVID-19 Era](#)

This article in *The American Journal of Managed Care* outlines various strategies that health care facilities can develop and implement to assist with the management of chronic diseases during the COVID-19 era. Strategies include developing a real-time clinical registry to identify and monitor both high-risk and rising-risk patients; developing both synchronous and asynchronous virtual care delivery tools to reduce in-person visits for patients with chronic diseases; and incorporating social networks (virtual group visits, etc.) in telehealth chronic disease management interventions.

### [Care of Older Adults in Rural Emergency Departments During the COVID-19 Pandemic](#)

This paper outlines the challenges presented by the unique needs of rural older adults during the COVID-19 pandemic and briefly describes the care of older adults in the rural emergency department, the care of older adults during the COVID-19 pandemic, and the emergency care of those older patients suspected of COVID-19. The article highlights the necessity of re-engineering rural emergency department processes to better meet the needs of vulnerable older adults.

The surveys provide insight to the impact the pandemic has had on households' areas such as finances, housing, jobs, health care, transportation, care giving, and overall well-being. The household survey data is stratified by major cities, racial/ethnic groups, households with children, households located in rural communities, and households throughout the nation collectively.
